A very high risk of becoming Extinct in the Wild

Name	Lowland Anoa.
	There may be two species of Anoa as scientists are still unsure if the Mountain anoa (<i>Bubalus quarlesi</i>) is a distinct species.
Scientific Name	<i>Bubalus depressicornis</i>
Threats (what's hurting them)	Hunting and loss of habitat due to farming, logging and mining.
Distribution (where they live)	Found only on the islands of Sulawesi and Buton, Indonesia.
Habitat (what they live in)	Lowland forest
Diet/Feeding strategy (what they eat and how they eat it)	Herbivores - they forage on leaves, grass, twigs and fallen fruits.
Social behaviour (how they live)	Solitary
Males and females	Both males and females have horns. Males are darker in colour.
Lifespan (how long they live for)	20-30years
Number of young (how many babies)	One calf after a gestation of 275 – 315 days
Interesting fact	Anoa take their name from the Sulawesi word for 'buffalo' and are the smallest species of wild cattle.
